


Our Goal

Knowing

Our knowledge of truth and doctrine, most importantly about God

Being

Our identity as children of God, and the holiness He grows within us

Doing

Our actions; what we do to reflect God's character, whether through . . .

- Studying the Bible
- Serving others
- Sharing the gospel of Christ
- Or whatever else

Which Is the Most Important?

Being (Eph. 1:12)

The Doctrine of Holiness

God <u>calls</u> us to holiness (1 Pet. 1:14–16).

Holiness: Two Main Ideas

- God is <u>perfect</u>, without sin (1 John 1:5).
- God is <u>exalted</u> above all (Isa. 57:15).

Holiness: Our Personal Holiness Is . . .

- The work that <u>God</u> performs in us
- To set us apart from sin and to righteousness

Holiness: Our Personal Holiness Is . . .

 So that we reflect God's character

 Jesus <u>redeems</u> us to holiness.




The Doctrine of Holiness


