## A

**Almighty / Omnipotent** – Has the strength to do anything; "all mighty" (p. 25)

**Altar** – A place to offer sacrifices; often a stone mound or table (p. 121)

**Angel** – A powerful servant or messenger sent by God from heaven (p. 89)

Ark - A large boat or ship (p. 35)

**Ark of the Covenant** – A golden chest holding important things from Israel's history, including the Ten Commandments (p. 142)

## B

**The Bible** – The set of 66 books inspired by God (p. 6)

**Blemish** – A spot, defect, or mark; any part that is less than perfect (p. 82)

**Bless** – To give someone special help or grace (p. 39)

**Boil** – A painful, raised sore on a person's skin (p. 77)

## C

Calf - A young cow (p. 121)

**Cattle / Livestock** – Animals kept for work or food, including cows, camels, horses, and donkeys (p. 77)

**Chariot** – A two-wheeled cart pulled by horses, often used in battle (p. 88)

**Christ / Messiah** – A person chosen for a special role; the promised Jesus (p. 33)

**Command** – Another name for a law; to tell someone to do something (p. 53)

**Commandment** – A law or rule (p. 93)

**Compassion** – A gentle, loving desire to help someone (p. 59)

**Contentment** – Being thankful and happy with what you have (p. 119)

**Courage** – Doing the right thing even when you are afraid (p. 64)

**Covenant** – A binding promise or agreement (p. 36)

**Covet / Envy** – To want something that belongs to someone else, even if it's sinful to take (p. 118)

**Create** – To make something that is completely new (p. 19)

**Cubit** – A standard of measurement used in ancient times; about the length from a person's elbow to the tip of the fingers (p. 35)

## D

**Delight** – Enjoyment or happiness (p. 148)

**Deliver** – To bring; to carry over (p. 145)

**Devotion** – Total commitment; a promise to serve (p. 143)

**Dew** – Drops of water that collect on outdoor surfaces in the morning (p. 94)

**Disciple** – A student or follower who learns from a teacher (p. 12)

**Discipline** – Self-control; training to do what is good and healthy (p. 99)

**Dwell** – To stay or live (p. 149)

## E

**Elder** – A respected leader in a community (p. 115)

**Envy / Covet** – To want something that belongs to someone else, even if it's sinful to take (p. 118)

**Eternity** – The world beyond time where we will live forever (p. 151)

**Exodus** – Leaving or departing a place; Israel's departure from Egypt (p. 51)

#### F

**Faith** – A belief in something we cannot see or prove; trust in God (p. 13)

**False Witness / False Testimony** – A deception or lie told to others (p. 117)

**Father-in-Law** – The father of your husband or wife (p. 98)

**Firstborn** – The first child of a husband and wife (p. 80)

Flesh – The body; the human form (p. 128)

Forbidden – Not allowed; off limits (p. 28)



**Generation** – All the people born during the same time period, often 25–40 years (p. 135)

**Glorify** – To give honor and praise to someone; in Scripture, to point toward God's glory

**Glory** – The honor, praise, or credit for being great

**The Gospel** – The "good news" about Jesus (p. 34)

**Grain** – Small seeds like corn or wheat; used to plant crops or make bread (p. 127)

**Gratitude** – Being thankful for what we have; valuing God's blessings (p. 95)

## H

**Hail** – Round chunks of ice that can fall during strong storms (p. 77)

**Heaven** – An old word for the sky or any place above the Earth (p. 19)

**Holy** – Set apart as special, or sacred (p. 25)

**Humility** – Understanding your limits; the opposite of sinful pride (p. 78)



**Idol** – A statue of a false god (p. 110)

**Idolatry** – The worship of idols or false gods (p. 110)

**Inspire** – To move, guide, or influence (p. 6)

**Israel** – A name for God's chosen nation or people (p. 10)



**Judge** – To declare something right or wrong; to decide what is just and fair (p. 98)



**Leprosy** – A disease that could result in sores, loss of feeling, and whitened skin (p. 63)

**Levite** – A person from the tribe of Levi (p. 125)

**Lintel** – The board across the top of a door (p. 80)

**Livestock / Cattle** – Animals kept for work or food, including cows, camels, horses, and donkeys (p. 77)

**Locust** – A grasshopper that travels in a swarm, often damaging crops (p. 77)

**Loyalty** – The state of being loyal; staying faithful, true, or loving to someone (p. 110)



**Manna** – A bread-like food that God gave Israel in the wilderness (p. 94)

**Memorial** – Something that helps us remember an important person or event (p. 144)

**Mercy** – Kindness and compassion toward someone who might not deserve it (p. 46)

**Messiah / Christ** – A person chosen for a special role; the promised Jesus (p. 33)

**Midwife** – A woman who helps pregnant mothers give birth to their babies (p. 53)

**Miracle** – An event caused by God that breaks the laws of nature (p. 41)

**Offer / Sacrifice** – To give up something, often to serve or worship God (p. 37)

**Offspring / Seed** – Children or descendants (p. 32)

**Omnipotent / Almighty** – Has the strength to do anything; "all mighty" (p. 25)

## P

**Parable** – A story that pictures a lesson (p. 14)

**Passover** – A holiday celebrating the time God rescued the Israelites from Egypt (p. 81)

**Peninsula** – A piece of land surrounded by water on three sides

**Pharaoh** – A king or queen of Egypt (p. 45)

**Pillar** – A post or shaft that stands upright (p. 86)

**Plague** – A disaster for a large number of people (p. 76)

**Plunder / Spoil** – To take treasure from an enemy, often after a battle (p. 84)

**Prevail** – To win against an enemy; to succeed (p. 97)

**Pride** – An overly high opinion of yourself and your abilities (p. 78)

**Priest** – A person who performs religious duties; in Israel, an adult male who helped the people worship God and offer sacrifices (p. 125)

**Prophet** – Someone chosen by God to share a message (p. 10)

**Psalm** – A sacred song or poem (p. 90)

**Quail** – A kind of bird, somewhat smaller than a chicken (p. 93)



**Rebel** – To oppose a ruler or some other authority, often with violence (p. 134)

**Rebuke** – To tell people that they have done wrong; to correct (p. 43)

**Refuge** – A safe, protected place (p. 148)

**Repent** – To regret sin and turn back toward God; to ask God to forgive you (p. 34)



**Sabbath** – A day of the week set aside from work; kept for rest and worship (p. 25)

**Sacrifice / Offer** – To give up something, often to serve or worship God (p. 37)

**Salvation** – Saving someone from harm; in Scripture, God rescuing us (p. 90)

**Sanctify** – To set apart as holy or sacred (p. 128)

**Sanctuary** – A safe, holy place blessed by God (p. 125)

**Scarlet** – A bright red color (p. 145)

**Scout / Spy** – Someone who travels ahead of a group to explore a place (p. 133)

**Scripture** – Religious writing; another name for the Bible (p. 7)

**Seed / Offspring** – Children or descendants (p. 32)

**Seek** – To look or search for (p. 140)

**Serpent** – A snake (p. 29)

**Shepherd** – Someone who takes care of sheep or other herd animals (p. 59)

**Sin** – The decision to break God's law; turning away from God (p. 29)

**Slave** – Someone who works for no pay, often a prisoner against their will (p. 43)

**Spoil / Plunder** – To take treasure from an enemy, often after a battle (p. 84)

**Spy / Scout** – Someone who travels ahead of a group to explore a place (p. 133)

**Steward** – Someone who takes care of another person's property; a manager or caretaker (p. 22)

**Subject** – Obedient; under authority (p. 115)

**Sustain** – To hold up; to help and support (p. 69)

**Swear** – To promise something while accepting the consequences (p. 145)

**Tabernacle** – A large tent where God showed His presence to Israel (p. 125)

**Tablet / Table** – Flat pieces of stone carved with writing (p. 122)

**Tempt** – To invite someone to do wrong (p. 29)

**Testament** – A promise or record; a name for the two major parts of the Bible (p. 10)

**Translate** – To change words from one language to another; to interpret (p. 9)

**Unleavened Bread** – Bread that has no yeast or has not been allowed to rise (p. 81)



**Vain** – With no good purpose; useless (p. 112)



**Weep** – To cry or sob; to be overwhelmed by sadness (p. 139)

**Wilderness** – A large area of nature with few people, away from towns or cities (p. 87)

**Wisdom** – The ability to use knowledge well; understanding (p. 87)
